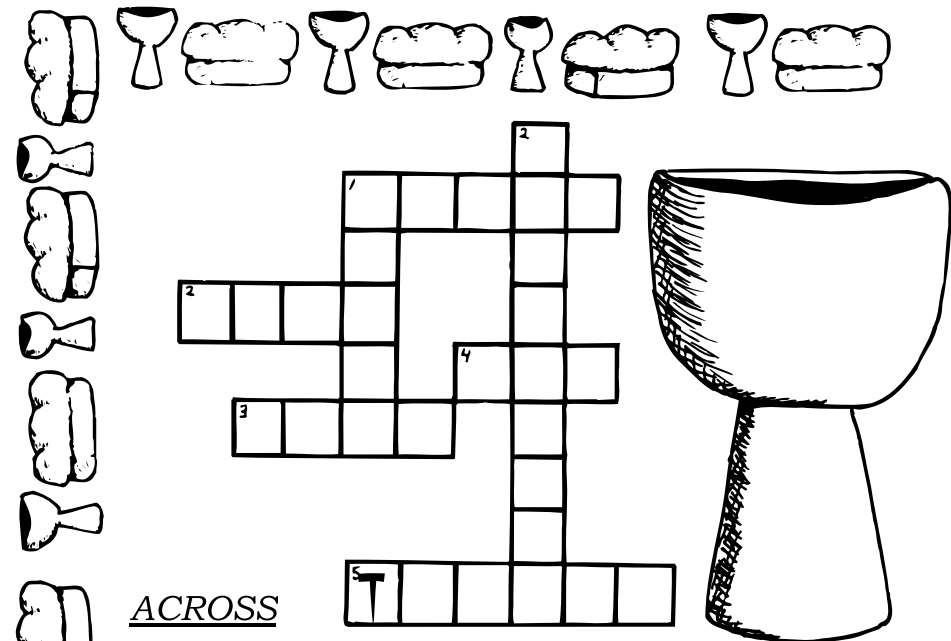


# Kidsword

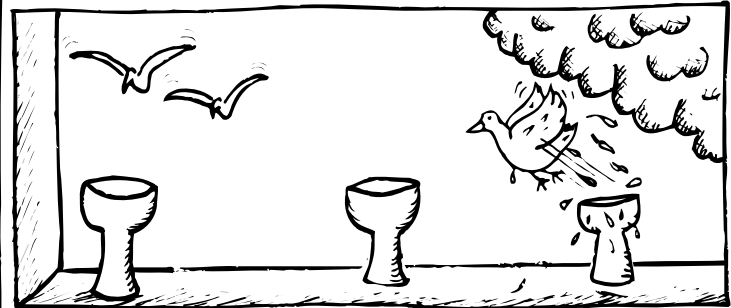
On the night he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, broke it and . . .

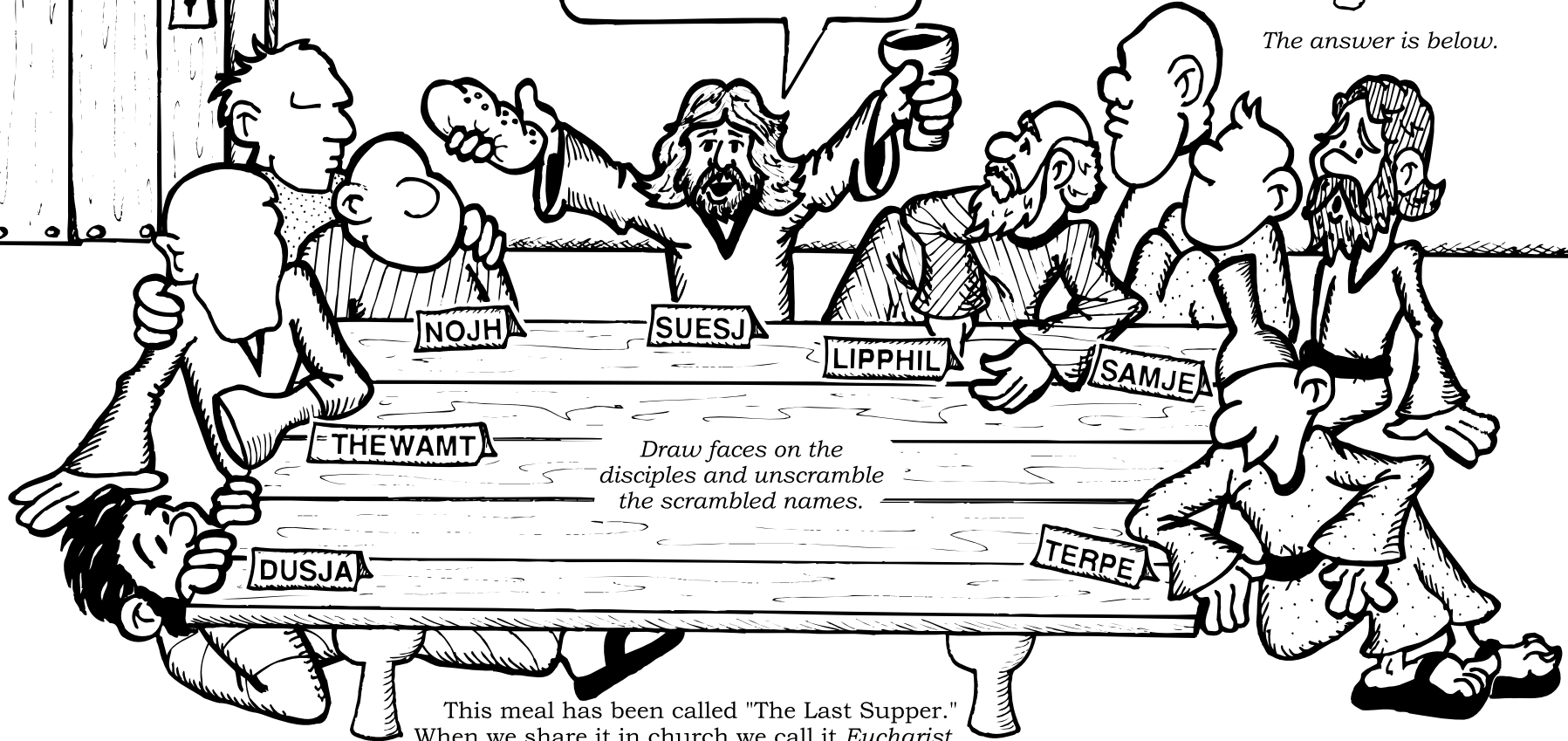
Jesus came to give his life for us. He gave his body and blood to take away our sin. The killing of animals could never really take sin away; but Jesus has.
