




Jesus' enemies paid Judas, one of Jesus disciples, to tell them where Jesus and the other disciples were staying.



Count the number of silver coins he took. Some are hidden.





After he took the money, Judas knew he had done something very wrong. He took the money back to the priests, threw it on the ground, and said . . .






Fill in the missing vowels.
